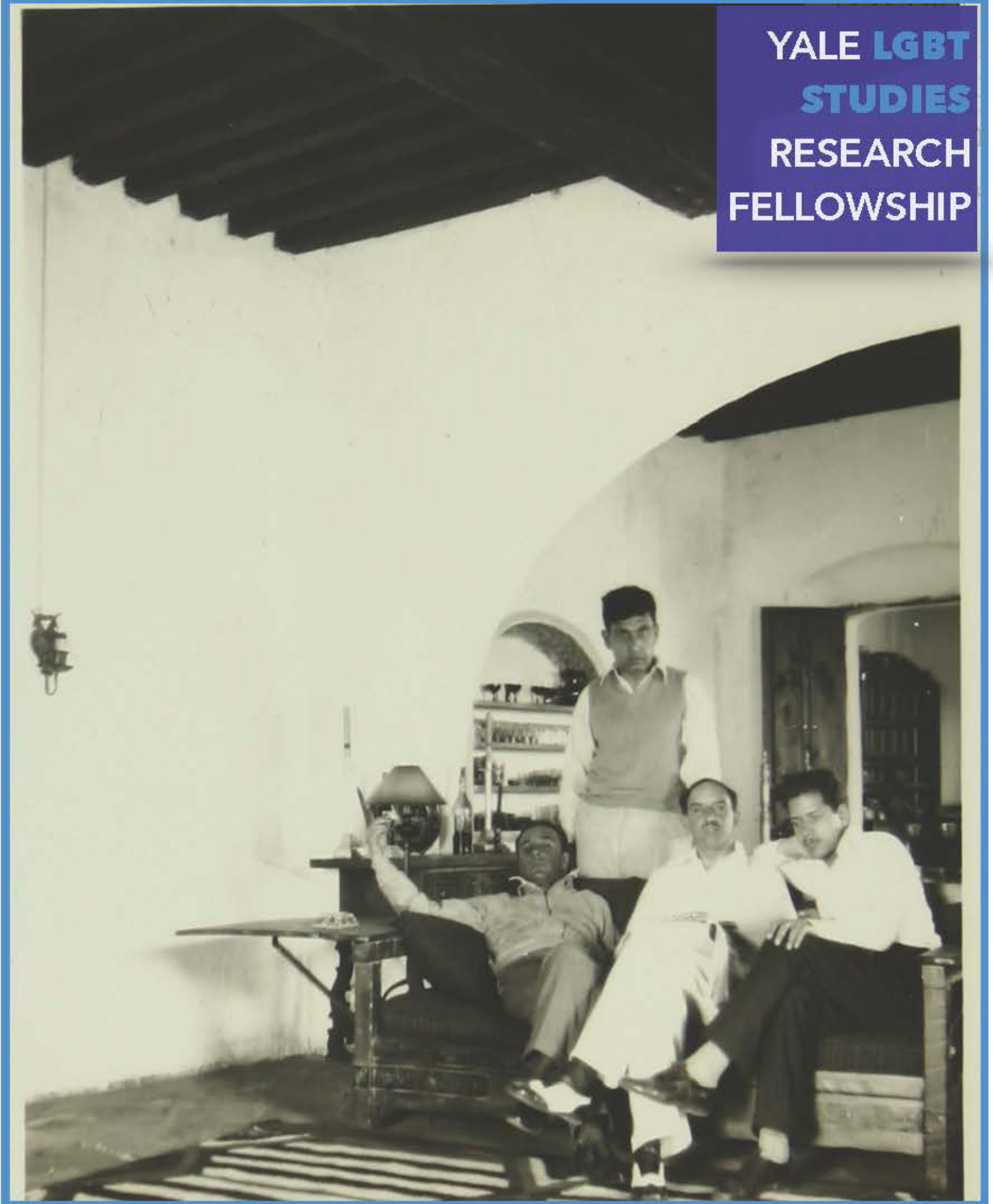

Victor Macías-González is professor of History and Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies at the University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse. His research interests focus broadly on gender, sexuality, class, and material culture of Mexico in the long nineteenth century

(1750-1930). He is a specialist of the Porfirian age in Mexico (1876-1911) and his publications have analyzed the Mexican aristocracy, manuals of etiquette, portraiture, genealogy, consumption, and leisure. Professor Macías-González is the

inaugural recipient of the Yale LGBT Studies Research Fellowship.
